No Mining on 340,000 acres in the Methow Valley

There is good news for environmental protection of the Method Valley with the passing of a bill that will protect the valley from large-scale mine development. The Methow Valley is a beautiful place and the location of two of our favorite paddling rivers - the Methow River and the Twisp. It is also the location were with In recent years, private companies have been pursuing exploratory drilling at a mineral prospect containing copper, gold and silver



in the vicinity of Mazama, Washington. On February 13, 2019, The Natural Resources Management Act (also known as the Public Lands Package) passed out of the U.S. Senate. This package includes a number of bills for natural resource protection, including the Methow Headwaters Protection Act – that withdrawals 340,079 acres of U.S. Forest Service land from any new mineral exploration and large industrial mine development. The bill is expected to pass in the House.


